## Getting Started

**Thank you for your service!** In honor of your service, your community is giving back to you. This booklet outlines the commonly-used veteran services agencies in Brown County for returning veterans, retirees, and their spouses or widows.

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### Where do I get immediate help?

#### 24-hour Crisis Center Hotline (920-436-8888)

The Crisis Center of Family Services provides free, professional, short-term counseling for any situation, including: alcohol and drug abuse, depression, relationship issues, and suicide. A counselor will talk with you about your situation and the kind of help you need.

## Benefits

There are state and federal benefits available to veterans & their families. Each program has different eligibility criteria. To find out if you are eligible, contact one of the agencies listed below.

### Brown County Veterans Service Office

Staff help you determine your eligibility and apply for state & federal benefits, including: service-connected disabilities, pensions, DD-214, death/burial & end-of-life, education, employment, health care, home buying, POWs, transportation, and services for returning veterans.

## Healthcare

### Green Bay Health Care Center (Milo C. Huempfer Clinic)

The Veterans Administration (VA) has an outpatient clinic located in Green Bay. This clinic provides a variety of services, such as: primary care, specialty care, mental health care & support groups, dietetic counseling, pharmacy, and assistance with benefits, including in-home care. The Green Bay Health Care Center is also a Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute (WAI)-affiliated memory assessment clinic. **Please note: not all veterans are eligible for all VA clinic services. ## *Mental Health/Counseling*

If you or a loved one is struggling to cope with the effects of combat, there are places specifically for veterans and their families to get the help they need.

### **Green Bay Vet Center**

Vet Centers are agencies under the VA Clinics that specifically offer counseling services. Individual or group sessions are available for warzone veterans and their family members. **Please note: you do not have to be eligible for care at a VA Clinic in order to receive help at a Vet Center.**

### **Green Bay Health Care Center (Milo C. Huempfer Clinic)**

The Veterans Administration (VA) has an outpatient clinic located in Green Bay. Mental health care is available beyond counseling services, including support groups for different mental health conditions and a memory assessment clinic, affiliated with the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute (WAI). **Note: not all veterans are eligible for all VA clinic services. ## *Employment/Job Searching*

### **Center for Veterans Issues (CVI)**

This Madison-based organization finds job opportunities within the State of Wisconsin agencies for veterans. To be eligible, you must have a service-connected disability rating of 30% or more, and not currently employed in a permanent State of Wisconsin position.

## *Housing/Homelessness*

Returning veterans may have difficulty finding a place to live. If you need assistance finding and paying for housing while you transition back into civilian life, there are programs & organizations that can help.
