He's in court everyday and has already been successful in getting cases filed and is off to a great start. Zakowski stated that they are

keeping statistics in terms of cases that Liegeois is generating and will report quarterly to the committee.

17. COMMUNICATION FROM SUPERVISOR NORBERT DANTINNE RE: REQUEST PERMISSION TO STORE A BOAT AT BAY SHORE PARK BY THE NEW FRANKEN FIRE DEPARTMENT TO BE USED FOR BAY RESCUES. (REFERRED FROM APRIL COUNTY BOARD. ALSO REFERRED TO EDUCATION & RECREATION COMMITTEE ON MAY 1, 2008.)

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR ANDREWS TO RECEIVE AND PLACE ON FILE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

18. COMMUNICATION FROM SUPERVISOR NORBERT DANTINNE RE: LOOK INTO WHY IT TOOK 5 ½ HOURS FOR A PATROL OFFICER TO RESPOND TO A CALL FROM THE SCOTT TOWN CHAIRMAN. (REFERRED FROM APRIL COUNTY BOARD.)

Town of Scott Chairman, Mike VanLanen, came forward and explained the scenario that had happened with regard to this response call. He called in a routine vandalism call at 2:30 p.m. and was told there was a shift change. So he called back at 3:30 p.m. and waited until 8:30 p.m. for an officer to respond to take a report. The officer explained the workload, and told him that calls are taken by priority and that he was patrolling the area from Denmark to Dyckesville. VanLanen was here to make a point that the Brown County Sheriff's Department needed to add more patrolmen in the rural areas. He provided a handout (attached) with his concerns regarding the Town of Scott. Van Lanen is concerned for his constituents and is also concerned for the overworked police officers.

Supervisor Clancy stated this had been addressed during budget time and he felt the priority just wasn't there. Brown County is in need of more officers and suggested having Mr. VanLanen show up at budget time to explain his concerns.

Sheriff Kocken responded that there were a lot of things that went into this call explaining the officers were tied up at the time. If this was a priority call in need of an officer, one would have been found.

Supervisor Andrews questioned if they track the amount of time it takes from when a call comes in to when an officer responds. Kocken responded he would look into the emergency calls and to see what he could find out.

Supervisor Dantine questioned an officer's performance and if it is cost effective for overtime. Kocken responded that there have been studies regarding this and an officer is less effective when he or she works long hours. In conclusion Kocken would do a study on this and ended by stating if he thought there were not enough officers on a job, it would be his obligation to add more.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR CLANCY TO RECEIVE AND PLACE ON FILE AND ADVISE MR. VAN LANEN TO PARTICIPATE AT BUDGET TIME. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

19. COMMUNICATION FROM SUPERVISOR NORBERT DANTINNE RE: LOOK INTO THE REASON OUR POLICE OFFICERS HAVE NO RADIO CONTACT IN VARIOUS AREAS OF BROWN COUNTY, SPECIFICALLY DYCKESVILLE, AND WHY THEY HAVE TO USE THEIR PERSONAL MOBILE PHONES TO MAKE CALLS IF RADIO DOESN'T WORK. (REFERRED FROM APRIL COUNTY BOARD.)

Supervisor Dantinne would like to know where Brown County is going and what steps are being taken in the next couple years so taxpayers' dollars are not being spent for new equipment for fire trucks that are going to be obsolete two years from now.

Fire Chief Kevin Thiels stated there are communication issues in Dyckesville and along the Bay of Green Bay. Brown County cannot use their radios in this area and have to use their cell phones. This has been an ongoing problem.

Public Safety Communications Director, Jim Nickel, explained that they have been struggling with communication issues since the system was put in in 1982. The difference now is that portables are being used because everyone is more accustomed to communicating on cell phones. There have been studies regarding the cost and alternatives during the years of 2003, 2004 and 2005. Technology has changed a lot in the past few years, and Brown County should take advantage of the changes if replacing the radio system. Over time, cellular systems have added more sites for more coverage. It has been determined that this is a \$25 million dollar problem. Nickel has been working with Executive Tom Hinz to try and understand where this would fit in a capital plan. There might be grants available, however, Nickel stated this is not an easy problem to fix. In the meantime, there is a Federal mandate at the end of 2012 to take VHF equipment and narrowband it. Then Brown County will have to come up with a short term plan for use for the next couple of years. Answering Supervisor Nicholson's questions, Nickel explained there are no good short term fixes. He stated that putting up sites all over could cause an operational nightmare.

Supervisor Williams questioned if there is a way to reimburse for calls made on personal cell phones or provide them with cell phones. Nickel responded that this would be a departmental policy.

County Executive Hinz interjected that Brown County is in the process of building a new Communications Center and a Mental Health Center. The next priority after that has to be the public safety system. They have looked very hard into grants and the funding just isn't there.

Supervisor Nicholson asked Sheriff Kocken to look into the possibilities of providing cell phones to officers.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR ANDREWS TO RECEIVE AND PLACE ON FILE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

20. RESOLUTION RE: A LIMITATION OF CIVIL DAMAGES FOR INJURIES OR DEATH TO DOMESTIC ANIMALS BY OFFICERS ACTING IN THE LINE OF DUTY. (REFERRED FROM EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF APRIL 7, 2008.)

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR CLANCY TO APPROVE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

21. REQUEST FOR BUDGET TRANSFER (#08-27): INCREASE IN EXPENDITURES WITH OFFSETTING INCREASE IN REVENUE: TRACS GRANT PROGRAM WILL CONCLUDE AND WERE NOT INCLUDED IN 2008 BUDGET SO MUST BE ADDED (\$113,075).

Beth Rodgers, from Information Services, explained that the TraCS program is a traffic and citation software program for the officers to write traffic citations from their cars. In the past, this has been hand written, and then someone had to type it into the various systems for documentation. This budget transfer will automate that process and will move the date up to all the various systems including court. The program was started almost three years ago and received three grants. This will be finished within the next few months.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR CLANCY TO APPROVE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

22. KEY FACTOR REPORT 2008 WITH JAIL AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION BY MONTH AND OVERTIME BY EXPENDITURES BY DIVISION/SESSION 2008 – FOR MAY 2008 MEETING.

Sheriff Kocken informed the committee that the inmates they board from the State of Wisconsin and the Marshall's office, was put in the budget. Brown County can handle about 50 inmates, and this committee decided during budget time to take about 20 more inmates. They are going to have a difficult time getting 20 more inmates and to provide room for them. This will leave a shortfall in revenue at the end of the year of close to \$500,000.

Supervisor De Wane felt this committee should re-look at this. Any time a department needs their budget to be determined by something they can't see, whether they can hit the numbers or not, doesn't work in their favor.

Supervisor Nicholson would like Sheriff Kocken to keep the committee updated monthly regarding this.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR ANDREWS TO RECEIVE AND PLACE ON FILE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

23. BUDGET STATUS FINANCIAL REPORT FOR MARCH 31, 2008.

Sheriff Accountant, Don Hein, stated based on where they are right now, fuel costs may contribute to about \$75,000 over budget due to the increase in gas

costs. They pushed their 2008 budget up. When possible the Sheriff is able to double up officers in cars to save on gas.

Sheriff Kocken stated they are contracted with a company in which any officer can go to any gas station and use a credit card and are able to deduct the State tax and Federal tax and it has been working out quite well.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUPERVISOR DE WANE AND SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR CLANCY TO RECEIVE AND PLACE ON FILE. VOTE TAKEN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

24. SHERIFF'S REPORT.

Sheriff Kocken reported on the following:

- 1) The jail laundry RFP is out and due back on Friday.
- 2) Immigration Custom Enforcement (ICE) training is scheduled for either late this month or in early June. Kocken will be able to give an update next month. Also, the Attorney General was here last week, and he is going to try and get people from the State to be in a relationship between the Federal Government and local agencies to try and get this program up and running to make sure illegal criminals are not in our area.
- 3) National Correction Officers week is tomorrow, Thursday, May 08, 2008. County Executive, Tom Hinz, and the Sheriff are going to the new jail on Curry Lane to talk to a few of the correction officers. The committee is welcome to come and a tour may be available.

Kocken explained the Dept of Transportation was awarded \$500,000 from the Federal Government to patrol Highway 41 to cut down on aggressive driving. This is a very good program with anticipated success.
